

# DEGREES AND CURRICULA IN THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

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## INTRODUCTORY STATEMENT

The College of Education was established by the University to provide for the education of teachers, administrators, and other school personnel. The curricula of the College give students an opportunity to equip themselves for the kind of educational work in which they are interested.

Students in elementary education have observation and student teaching in the University Elementary School and in the schools of nearby communities. Students in secondary education have observation and student teaching in the University High School and in other secondary schools. Each student is given an opportunity to learn accepted and desirable method and to develop skill in teaching.

Through the cooperation of various county boards of education, students preparing to teach agriculture and home economics have an opportunity to observe and do their student teaching in the high schools near Lexington which offer vocational agriculture and vocational home economics. Students in both agriculture and home economics teach under skilled supervisors in their respective fields.

The University offers a fifth year of teacher education through internships in public school systems in or near Lexington. These internships are open to graduate students who have strong scholarship records and who have had successful student teaching experience.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Requirements for admission to the College of Education, as a freshman, or with advanced standing, or as a special student, are the same as those outlined on the preceding pages for admission to the University. A student transferring to the College of Education from another college on the campus or from another institution must have a standing of 2.0 or above. In order to be eligible to enroll in any education course the student must have a standing of 2.0 or above.

## STUDENT TEACHING

*A student is not permitted to enroll for student teaching unless he is classified as a senior or graduate student, has spent at least one semester in residence on the campus, has completed at least 18 semester hours in the field in which the student teaching is to be done, has completed 8 semester hours in education, and satisfies the following requirements:*

1. A standing of 2.0 in the major, minor, or area of concentration in which the student teaching is to be done.
2. A standing of 2.0 in professional courses.
3. An over-all standing of 2.0 for the entire college period.
