

Fauces abates at the same time with the eruption and fever. This form of Scarlet fever runs its course if not complicated in about a week.

The *S. Anginosa* is attended with greater depression of the system than the *S. Simplex*, the febrile symptoms run higher, the pulse is quicker, more frequent & small, and not <sup>so</sup> strong and full as in the simple variety; the swelling of the throat and fauces is much greater as well as the soreness, redness & inflammation. The redness & dryness extends down the middle of the tongue, about the fauces there is generally a copious secretion, which might lead a careless observer to suppose <sup>his</sup> patient was laboring under a salivation, if mercury had been given, but is the result of the inflamed condition of the fauces, and is copious when the inflammation of the throat is comparatively mild, and more viscid, tough & scanty when the inflammation of the throat runs higher. There is considerable headache, nausea and vomiting, swelling of the tonsils, fauces, and glands of the neck, the muscles of the neck & lower jaw are affected frequently with stiffness. The mucous membrane of the mouth and fauces is of a vivid red color, and when the blood is exhaled from them, it frequently acquires <sup>a dark</sup> color, which has the appearance of sloughing ulcers, as the breath is at the same time offensive, but these excretions & viscid secretions can be detached from the membrane, the inflamed, the inflamed points when
