Seat, Sheriff of Fulton County, and Coalder Johnson, his Deputy Sheriff, who each took the oath prescribed by Sec. 4251 of the Kentucky Statutes, as to certifying to delinquent lists; and \$08 polls at \$1 each, amounting to \$808, were allowed that said Seat as delinquent; and the \$2,100 was allowed the same said Seat as delinquent personal property, at 40c per \$100, amounting to \$840.	
Ordered that the Court levy for the year 1908 on each	

\$100 worth of property as shown in the tax book in this county be placed at 30 cents ad valorem tax to be collected and used for a general fund, and that \$1 be levied as a poll tax on each male resident in this county over 21 years of age, to be collected and applied to the general fund of said county.

By motion, it is ordered that a levy of 5 cents on each \$100 worth of taxable property be levied for the purpose of paying for teams to pull the graders, plows and scrapers to work the roads; it is further ordered that no teams be hired except upon the written order of the magistrate of the district in which said work is done, and said order is also signed by the County Judge.

Ordered that all overseers on public roads be and are hereby allowed \$2.00 per year for warning in hands.
