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
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THE SAVING OF A SOUL

THE PLATFORM OF CHRIST'S CHURCH

In seeking an objective men sometimes state the platform on which that objective is sought. Our objective at this time is not a setting forth of the "creed" of the church, for the Church of Christ has no creed but Christ, no article of faith except Christ, no church manual except the Bible, no confession of faith but that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Instead, it is a setting forth of the platform upon which the church stands and upon which it comes before the world. I shall state briefly this platform as of five planks, which I believe comprehends the platform upon which the apostles stood in years gone by. I will split plank one in about half because it would take up too much space to print it.

PLANK ONE:

THE BIBLE, THE WORD OF GOD, IS THE COMPLETE REVELATION OF GOD

Jesus said, "And this is life eternal, that they should know thee the only true God, and him who thou didst send, even Jesus Christ" (John 17:3). 1. All men must know God: hear, learn, come. 2. But men can know God only as God has revealed Himself, made Himself known. 3. Therefore, God must have made Himself known, must have completely revealed Himself for man to know Him.

Jesus further claimed that God was revealing Himself in the son. "Have I been so long time with you, and dost thou not know me, Phillip?" said Jesus. "He that hath seen me hath seen the father; how sayest thou, show us the father? Believeest thou not that I am in the father... but the father abiding in me doth his works." (John 14:9, 10).

This word which the Father spoke through Him, he committed to the apostles which they were to deliver to the world. He prayed to the Father: "I glorified thee on earth, having accomplished the work which thou hast given me to do... For the words which thou gavest me I have given unto them; and they received them, and knew of a truth that I came forth from thee, and they believeth that thou didst send me... I have given them my word; and the world hated them, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of this world... Neither for these do I pray, but for them also that believe on me through thy word." (John 17:4, 8, 14, 20).
