The influence of climate in the production of Scrophula has been supposed to be very great.

The inhabitants of those countries, which are subject to a variable state of climate, the atmosphere at all times either cold or humid, are much more liable to the disease, than those living in a more uniform temperature.

Scrophula is produced in its worst forms in the mountainous regions of Switzerland and regions similarly situated.

Those regions are so situated, that the heat and light of the sun seem in some degree to be excluded.

The action of the atmosphere is partial and confined, loaded with humidity and chillingly cold.

The disease has often appeared in our own country in such situations as above mentioned.

Persons whose employment predisposes them to the disease, are those, confined to large manufacturing establishments, the unwholesome atmosphere, meagre diet, and want of cleanliness, which are generally the ac-
