College for Stanton.
 At an impromptu meeting held at the court house in Stanton Saturday on the arrival of Dr. E. O. Guerrant and Dr. Hutchinson, the latter of Pittsburg, Pa., and a representative of the United Presbyterian church, and who is seeking a location for a college in Eastern Kentucky, a nice subscription was started as an inducement to having it located here. The sum of \$2300.00 was subscribed, and Mr. J. C. Patrick proposed to donate ten acres of land for the site of the school. This is an opportunity to be taken advantage of, and it is to be hoped that every citizen in the county will be interested in the work.
 Messrs. E. H. Fuller, J. C. Patrick and J. D. Atkinson were appointed a committee to solicit subscriptions, and hope to increase the amount considerably before August 5 when the Board of the church meets to hear Dr. Hutchinson's report.
