Visiting the Chester Bakers Sunday were Mr. and Mrs. Bill Craft and family and Mr. and Mrs. Dow Baker of Kona.

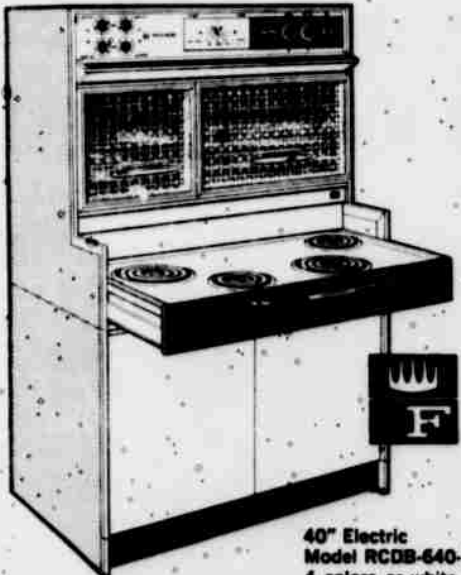
Miss Vina May Couch is in business for herself. She makes pot holders and sells them for 20¢ each. Good for you, Vina! Big business start on a small scale.

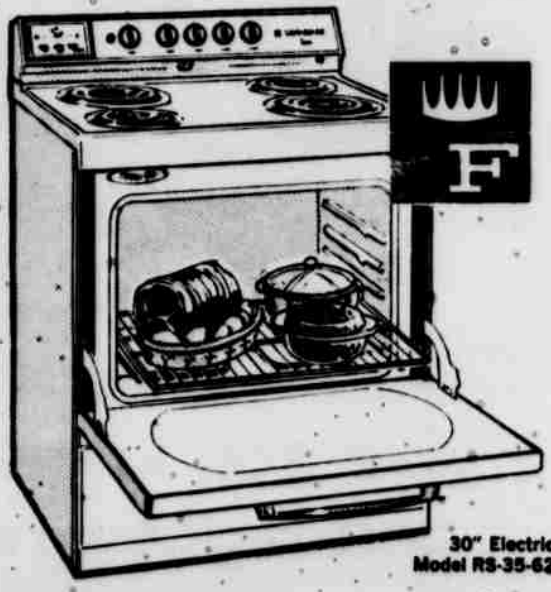
