Sealed proposals for general construction to include plumbing, heating, electrical work, painting and all else of additions to a school building located in Blackey, Letcher County, Kentucky, will be received by the Letcher County Board of Education, Whitesburg, Kentucky, at the office of the Board of Education, Whitesburg, Kentucky, up to 5:00 p. m., EST, June 22, 1961, and then there opened and publicly read aloud.

Plans, specifications, information for bidders and other documents may be examined without charge at the office of the Letcher County Board of Education, or at the office of H. A. Spalding, Hazard, Kentucky.

A set of plans and documents may be obtained at the office of the Engineer upon a deposit of \$25.00 for each set. Any bidder, upon returning such set promptly in good condition, will be refunded such deposit, and any non-bidder, upon returning such set within 10 days after the bid opening, will be refunded one-half of such deposit. Additional sets may be obtained for \$25.00, half of which will be refundable upon their prompt return.

The Letcher County Board of Education reserves the right to waive any informalities in or reject any and all bids and to negotiate with the apparently successful bidder.

Each bidder must deposit with a bid, bond or security in an amount of not less than five per cent (5%) of the base bid in the same and such other conditions provided in "Information for the Bidder"; the successful bidder shall enter into written contract with the board for the construction of said building in accordance with the said plans and specifications and shall execute a surety bond by a solvent surety company to the said Board in the full amount of said bid, conditioned upon the provisions of said contract and the payment of all labor and supplies used in the construction of said building.

No bidder may withdraw his bid within 10 days of the date of the actual opening thereof.

All bids shall be sealed and addressed to the Letcher County Board of Education and delivered to Dr. B. F. Wright, chairman, Whitesburg, Kentucky.
