

Escapeth the Jews.

hath a devil, and is mad; why hear ye him?  
 21 Others said, These are not the words of him that hath a devil. Can a devil open *w* the eyes of the blind?  
 22 ¶ And it was at Jerusalem the feast of the dedication, and it was winter.  
 23 And Jesus walked in the temple in Solomon's porch.  
 24 Then came the Jews round about him, and said unto him, How long dost thou *l* make us to doubt? If thou be the Christ, tell us plainly.  
 25 Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the *y* works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me.  
 26 But *z* ye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you.  
 27 My *a* sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:  
 28 And I give unto them eternal life; and they *b* shall never perish, neither shall any *man* pluck them out of my hand.  
 29 My *c* Father, which gave *d* them me, is greater than all; and no *man* is able to pluck *them* out of my Father's hand.  
 30 I *e* and my Father are one.  
 31 Then *f* the Jews took up stones again to stone him.  
 32 Jesus answered them, Many good works have I showed you from my Father; for which of those works do ye stone me?  
 33 The Jews answered him, saying, For a good work we stone thee not; but for blasphemy; and because *g* that thou, being a man, makest thyself God,  
 34 Jesus answered them, Is it not written in your law, I said, Ye are gods?  
 35 If he called them gods, unto whom the word of God came, and the scripture cannot be broken:  
 36 Say ye of him, whom the Father hath sanctified, *h* and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest; because I said, I am *i* the Son of God?  
 37 If *k* I do not the works of my Father, believe me not.  
 38 But if I do, though ye believe not me, believe the works: that ye may know, and believe, that the Father *l* is in me, and I in him.  
 39 Therefore they sought again to take him: but he escaped out of their hand,  
 40 And went away again beyond Jordan into the place *l* where John at first baptized; and there he abode.  
 41 And many resorted unto him, and said, John did no miracle: but

Christ raiseth Lazarus.

all things that John spake *m* of the man were true.  
 42 And many believed on him there.  
 CHAPTER XI.  
 1 Christ raiseth Lazarus. 47 The priests and Pharisees conspired against him.  
 NOW a certain man was sick, *n* named Lazarus, of Bethany, the town of *a* Mary and her sister Martha.  
 2 (It was *that* Mary which *b* anointed the Lord with ointment, and wiped his feet with her hair, whom *brother* Lazarus was sick.)  
 3 Therefore his sisters sent unto him, saying, Lord, behold, he whom thou lovest is sick.  
 4 When Jesus heard *that*, he said, This sickness is not unto death, but *d* for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby.  
 5 Now Jesus loved Martha, and her sister, and Lazarus.  
 6 When he had heard therefore that he was sick, he abode *twelve* days still in the same place where he was.  
 7 Then after that saith he to his disciples, Let us go into Judaea again.  
 8 His disciples say unto him, Master, the Jews of late *e* sought to stone thee; and goest thou thither again? *f*  
 9 Jesus answered, Are there not twelve hours in the day? If *g* a man walk in the day, he stumbleth not, because he seeth the light of this world.  
 10 But if a man walk in the night, he stumbleth, because there is no light in him.  
 11 These things said he: and after that he saith unto them, Our friend Lazarus sleepeth; *i* but I go, that I may awake him out of sleep.  
 12 Then said his disciples, Lord, if he sleep, he shall do well.  
 13 Howbeit Jesus spake of his death: but they thought that he had spoken of taking of rest and sleep.  
 14 Then said Jesus unto them plainly, Lazarus is dead.  
 15 And I am glad for your sakes, that I was not there, to the intent ye may believe; nevertheless I go unto him.  
 16 Then said Thomas, which was called Didymus, unto his fellow-disciples, Let us also go, that we may die with him.  
 17 Then when Jesus came, he found that he had *lain* in the bed four days already.
