

*Donovan Hall.* This is a residence hall for men, completed in 1955. It houses 350 students and contains a cafeteria seating 400 and several private dining rooms.

*Engineering Annex.* This building is located on Scott Street and is used by the Engineering College for additional drafting rooms and laboratories.

*Erikson Home Economics Building.* The offices, laboratories, and classrooms of the School of Home Economics are located in this building.

*Euclid Avenue Classroom Building.* This building houses the office of the Department of Air Science of the Reserve Officers Training Corps, and classroom facilities for the Department of Physical Education and the College of Commerce.

*Faculty Club.* Formerly the Patterson Home, this house is now occupied by the University Faculty Club.

*Farm Service Building.* This building houses the farm maintenance department, the animal nutrition laboratory, various storage rooms, and shops for repair and storage of farm machinery and equipment.

*Fine Arts Building.* This building houses the departments of Art, Music, Dramatics, and Speech. A feature of the building is the air-conditioned Guignol Theatre seating approximately 425 persons. Temporary offices of the Dean of the College of Medicine are also located in this building.

*Food Storage Building.* This building provides warehouse space for all University food service units, complete facilities for processing of meats and fresh vegetables, and storage of frozen foods.

*Football Dressing Rooms.* This building, located at the football practice field, contains shower rooms, locker rooms, equipment room, trainer's room, and lecture room for football teams.

*Frazee Hall.* Frazee Hall houses the Extended Programs and the Department of History.

*Freeman House.* Temporary offices for the Medical Center staff are located in this building.

*The W. D. Funkhouser Biological Sciences Building.* This building houses the departments of Anatomy and Physiology, Bacteriology, Botany, and Zoology. The Biological Sciences Library is also located here.

*Enoch Grehan Journalism Building.* This building houses the School of Journalism, the Kernel Press, The Kentucky Kernel, the Kentuckian, the central office of the Kentucky Press Association, and complete photographic facilities.

*Hamilton House.* This is a cooperative house for women students.

*Health and Hygiene Building.* This structure houses the University Health Service, the Department of Hygiene and Public Health, and the Infirmary.

*Highway Materials Research Laboratory.* This laboratory is jointly operated by the Department of Civil Engineering and the State Department of Highways.

*Holmes Hall.* This is a residence hall for women, activated in 1958. It houses approximately 300 students and contains a formal reception room, a recreation room, and a sun deck.

*Insectary and Conservatory.* This building is a greenhouse and laboratory used by the Department of Entomology and Botany of the Experiment Station.

*Jewell Hall.* This is an addition to Boyd Hall, and is the third unit of the residence halls for women housing approximately 137 students.
