

the Professor of Military Science and Tactics for further training. Recommendations for this course will be limited to those students who have manifested special interest and demonstrated ability during the basic course, and who meet other standards, with a view to qualifying for a commission in the United States Army Reserve. An advanced course student, who makes and maintains a minimum graduation point standing of 2.5 and meets other standards, may be designated a Distinguished Military Student which makes him eligible to apply for a commission in the Regular Army. A Distinguished Military Student may be designated a Distinguished Military Graduate upon his being awarded a baccalaureate degree, provided he continues to meet the required standards.

The Military Science Department offers two programs leading to a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Military Science.

MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURES

The Department of Modern Foreign Languages and Literatures embraces the five major European languages: French, German, Spanish, Italian, and Russian. Undergraduate students are offered the choice of three specialized curricula leading to the A.B. degree with a major in French, German, or Spanish. On the graduate level, the Department offers advanced work in the literature and philology of each of these three languages, leading at present to the Master of Arts degree.

As a branch of the liberal arts curriculum, one of the fundamental aims of language study must be to broaden and deepen our acquaintance with the world about us by presenting new aspects of its culture and a more intimate knowledge of its peoples through the medium of foreign languages and literatures. In addition, the Department provides training for those interested in entering the diplomatic and various other Government services where knowledge of foreign languages is required; it offers specialized preparation to prospective high school and college language teachers; it furnishes graduate and science students with the training necessary to use foreign language books and periodicals for reference and research.

MUSIC

The music department provides the opportunity for cultural and professional growth through intensive music study and participation, and presents a varied series of musical programs of cultural value to the entire university community.

A student whose prime interest is music may work toward the Bachelor of Music degree in Applied Music or Music Education, or the Bachelor of Arts degree. The courses of study leading to the Bachelor of Music degree are designed for those who plan to be professional performing musicians or school music teachers, and presume a considerable amount of musical experience on the pre-college level. The Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in music is a general cultural degree with emphasis in music, allowing more time during the Junior and Senior years for the election of courses in related and other subject matter fields. All degrees offered by the Department of Music demand the fulfillment of the basic lower division course requirements of the College of Arts and Sciences as listed on page 54, in the belief that the ideas and concepts derived from such study are essential to the happiness and well-being of every individual.
