

Corn meal	6 lbs.
Bran	3 lbs.
Middlings	3 lbs.
Ground oats	3 lbs.
Meat meal	5 lbs.
Charcoal	1 lb.
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Total	21 lbs.

The grain mixture consisted of the following feeds:

Wheat	16 lbs.
Cracked corn	16 lbs.
Oats	8 lbs.
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Total	40 lbs.

The grain mixture was fed in the litter twice daily, one-third of the total amount fed being given in the morning and two-thirds in the evening. This grain was mixed up well in the straw by kicking up the litter when the grain was fed. The mash was fed in the dry form and kept before the birds at all times. A balance was kept between the two feeds by aiming to feed twice as much grain by weight as the birds consumed of the mash.

The great lesson to be learned from this contest is, that if we are to have more profitable poultry in Kentucky, we must first of all keep pure bred stock. Then we must give this stock proper housing facilities and feed it a well balanced ration.
