

### WOMAN'S SELF-GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION

The government of all women students living in the halls of residence, sorority houses or private boarding houses is in charge of the W. S. G. A. The object of the association is to regulate all matters pertaining to the student life of its members which do not fall under the jurisdiction of the faculty; to foster a spirit of unity and loyalty to the University of Kentucky; to increase their sense of responsibility toward each other and to be a medium by which the social standards of the university can be made and kept high.

W. S. G. A. endeavors, by use of the point system, to regulate the girl's activities. It controls the offices one girl may hold and induces more girls to enter campus activities. The chairman of the Point System committee has charge of this work.

Even before a girl actually becomes a Ky. Co-ed she is brought into contact with an ever growing tradition—the Big and Little Sister movement. This is not a movement of a small group of women, but includes all the girls of the University who are willing to take the responsibility of introducing and entering women into Kentucky life. This system is sponsored by the W. S. G. A.

To care for the social activities of the women students there is a social committee whose duty it is to plan all the get-together parties through the year. For the enforcement of self-government each hall of residence and sorority house has a council, consisting of the house vice-president and three other members, with the exception of Patterson Hall, whose house council consists of the house vice-president, two senior, two junior and one sophomore representatives. The council which performs the executive work of the association is composed of the officers and representatives from the various sorority houses.
