#### Callaghan & Company Prize.

Callaghan & Company, Law Book Publishers, of Chicago, offer as a prize to the law student of the junior year who makes the best general average a Cyclopedic Law Dictionary.

#### Military Prizes.

A cash prize of \$65 will be awarded to the best drilled company.

\$5 medals will be awarded to the best drilled individual cadets in the freshman and sophomore classes respectively.

These prizes will be awarded at the annual Spring Competition.

#### Intercollegiate Apple Judging League Prize.

The Intercollegiate Apple Judging League offers a handsome silver trophy for the most expert judging by teams of three students each from the agricultural colleges composing the league. Students in pomology of the Kentucky College of Agriculture compete annually for this prize, which must be won in three successive contests before it becomes the permanent possession of any institution.

#### State Horticultural Society Prize.

In January, 1916, the Kentucky State Horticultural Society provided the "Junior Cup," a silver trophy, for excellence in apple judging by members of the junior class in pomology, the winner in each successive year for ten years to have his name inscribed upon the cup, which is to remain permanently in the care of the Department of Horticulture.

#### Commissioner of Agriculture Prizes.

The State Commissioner of Agriculture has provided prizes aggregating \$125 for the best judging of the various classes of live stock to be competed for annually by students of the College of Agriculture, at the Kentucky State Fair at Louisville.

#### A. S. H. B. Association Trophy.

The American Saddle Horse Breeders Association offers at the State Fair each year a handsome silver trophy to be given to the best student judge of saddle horses at the Fair.
