

Special Help Classes. The academic progress of all freshmen and most new students entering the University is followed throughout the academic year by securing grades from instructors at the end of the six weeks' period within each quarter. In the event the student is not making satisfactory progress, he is interviewed and every attempt is made to discover the particular difficulty. Special help is given in the form of help classes to those students who, because of inadequate background, are unable to progress satisfactorily.

Academic Probation. Students placed upon academic probation by the Registrar, the Deans of the Colleges of Arts and Sciences, Agriculture and Home Economics, Engineering, Education, and Commerce, are under the supervision of the University Personnel Office. The Personnel Director is secretary of the Scholarship and Attendance Committee.

Veterans. The University reception center for veterans is maintained in the University Personnel Office. Veterans who are receiving grants through the Veterans' Administration are cleared officially through this office. In order to purchase books under either Public Law 346 or 16 the veteran must receive official approval of his list of books from the University Personnel Office.

University Health Service

The University recognizes a special obligation in the health of the students. To meet this obligation it maintains the University Health Service to promote student health and to provide medical care particularly for students away from home.

The service consists of an out-patient clinic for ambulatory patients and for the preventive and corrective work, and a forty bed infirmary for the more acutely ill. X-ray and clinical laboratory services are provided.

Major surgical cases, after conference with parents or home physicians, may be referred to local surgeons and taken to local hospitals or, if the condition permits, may be taken to their surgeons. Serious or chronic conditions requiring long periods of hospitalization should be removed by parents or home physicians to other hospitals.

The cost of the service is covered by a special fee of \$2.50, paid by the student at the beginning of each quarter.

THE UNIVERSITY AND THE VETERAN
