

3. Official information (as detailed as possible) about any specialized military training for which he wishes to seek college credit. Such information may be covered in a Separation Form, letters from military authorities, a report from the Armed Forces Institute, or on USAFI Form No. 47 (Revised).
4. A Certificate of Eligibility and Entitlement, Public Law 346, or a letter indicating eligibility under Public Law 16. (No payment for subsistence may be made until a certificate has been filed with the University. The veteran should obtain his certificate from the Veterans Administration as soon as possible after discharge from military service.)
5. Sufficient funds to provide subsistence for two months.

#### **Credit for Training Taken While in Military Service**

With the exception noted below respecting military science, the University of Kentucky does not grant blanket credit for military service. Any credit allowed will be granted on the basis of demonstrated proficiency in a particular subject or subjects.

**The Army Specialized Training Program.** This program was offered at the University of Kentucky and all courses have been evaluated in terms of equivalent University courses and have been assigned credit values. Credit from other accredited institutions for courses taken in the ASTP will be accepted on transfer, provided that the amount in any particular course does not exceed the amount allowed by the University of Kentucky.

**The Engineers' Specialist School.** This school was operated at the University of Kentucky from September, 1942, to September, 1943, as a branch of the Engineers' School at Fort Belvoir, Virginia. Course equivalents have been determined and credit values have been assigned.

**ESMWT Courses.** Defense and war training courses in engineering, science, and management were offered at the University of Kentucky without credit. No credit is to be allowed for these courses.

**Courses Taken at Other Institutions.** As indicated above, the veteran may transfer to the University of Kentucky credit earned in military training courses at other institutions, provided that for any course offered at the University of Kentucky the credit will not be in excess of that allowed here. Credit for training programs not offered at the University of Kentucky (Navy V-12, etc.) will be accepted on transfer from other fully accredited institutions. Generally speaking, the amount allowed will be that recommended by the other institution. However, the University reserves the right to re-evaluate such credits, particularly when the amount assigned varies greatly from general practice.

**Credit in Military Service.** Any veteran who has had three months or more of military service may receive credit for the University's two-year elementary course in Military Science, or such part of it he has not already completed.

**Credit for Other Types of Military Training.** Credit for specialized training taken in other than accredited educational institutions will be allowed only on the basis of demonstrated proficiency in a particular sub-
