REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

For convenience of the work, the Station is divided into the following divisions:

Division of Chemistry,
Division of Entomology and Botany,
Division of Agriculture,
Division of Fertilizer Control Work,
Division of Food Control Work,
Division of Animal Husbandry.
