## Course Descriptions

### PROFESSIONAL COURSES

500 *Foundations of Librarianship.* (3)

Growth of librarianship as a profession and important literature of the field. The function, organization and services of libraries both historically and in contemporary society.

501 *Organization of Library Materials I.* (3)

Principles, concepts, methods, and problems in organizing library collections for effective use. Study of the fundamental principles and methods of classification and cataloging of books and non-book materials, bibliographical description and subject analysis.

502 *Reference and Information Services.* (3)

An introduction to reference materials, their content, evaluation, organization and use. Emphasis will be placed upon essential works, including dictionaries, encyclopedias, atlases, directories, year books, periodicals, indexes and other guides to basic reference materials.

503 *Development of Library Collections.* (3)

Selection and acquisition of library materials, analysis and evaluation of book selection aids in the several communication media. Emphasis will be placed on the structure of the booktrade, methods and criteria
