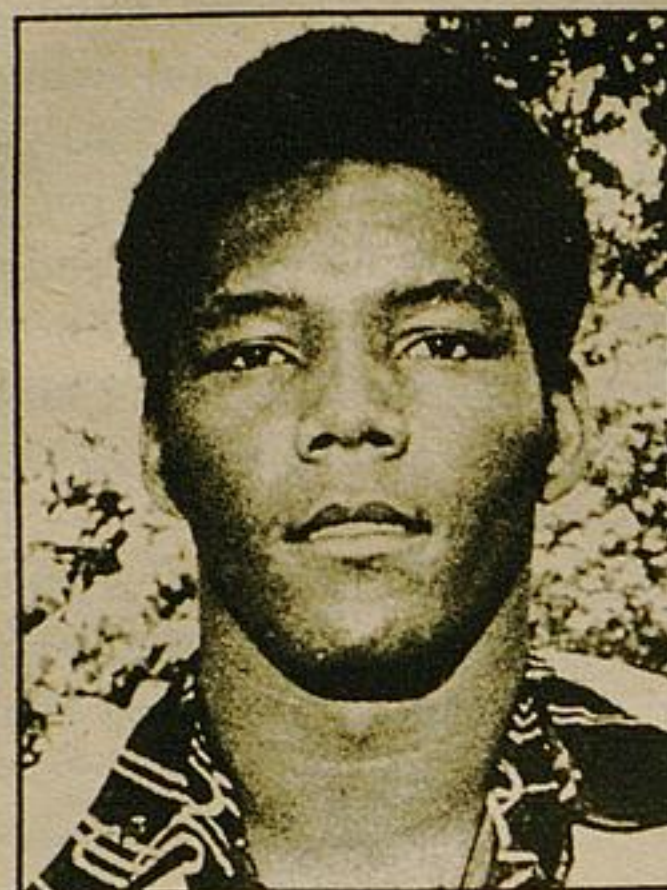

# UK Wrestling Team Opens New Season This Weekend

In three years at the University of Kentucky, Fletcher Carr has done more than just begin a wrestling program. He has molded a winning team, bringing his mat men from a first year 7-11-0 record to an impressive 26-5-0 in 1974-75 and an SEC championship and 11th place NCAA finish last season.

Carr began his wrestling career in the seventh grade under Coach Bill Brabender at Erie, Pa., and before Carr graduated from East High School he had won the city wrestling championship and was Pennsylvania state runner-up two years.

He also won four letters in track and was named to Erie's All-City football team, playing

both offensive and defensive tackle.

Carr started at center four years at the University of Tampa, earning a slot on the All-South Independent squad and mention as an All-American (1972).

While wrestling for Tampa, he was a four-time All-American and two-time NCAA College Division champion, took the Florida State championship four times and participated in the 1968 and 1972 Olympic Trials.

His competitive spirit also led him to a black belt and second place in the U.S. Karate Championships.

Along the way, Carr started all of his eight brothers, including UK's Joe and Jimmy, on the road to wrestling. He is the second of 16 children of the Rev. and Mrs. Fletcher Carr.

Carr, then 23 years of age, came to UK in 1973 as an assistant to football coach Fran Curci, who recruited him at Tampa, and head wrestling coach. He will concentrate solely on wrestling in the future.

A successful recruiter, Carr built the UK wrestling team from scratch, with his efforts being rewarded when his team won the conference championship and he was named SEC Coach of the Year for 1976.

**UK MAT OUTLOOK**

Any team featuring 10 returning conference place winners, including two All-Americans, would have good reason to look forward to a successful season, and that is exactly how things stand this season at the University of Kentucky.

The wrestling Wildcats will welcome back their entire SEC championship team, including five men who represented the school in the 1976 NCAA Tournament, along with a few outstanding recruits to bolster the ranks of 15 returning lettermen.

Joe Carr (167), a two-time NCAA bronze medalist, has a better shot than ever before at the NCAA gold medal, Kurt Mock (134) returns to improve his sixth-place showing, Garrett Headley (118) and Tim Mousetis (142) will serve as team co-captains and Harold Smith (190) should benefit much from a year of fine experience.

Jimmy Carr will give the 'Cats a big boost when he regains eligibility in the spring. Before being sidelined by a high school grade transcript technicality, he won the SEC crown at 126 in his freshman year. He became the No. 1 weight in the 1976 Olympic Qualifier in Cleveland last May, defeating such world class wrestlers as Don Behm, Jan Gitcho and Mark Massery.

Other SEC place winners returning to the lineup are Mark Randolph (126), Scott Crowell (150), Kelly Korth (158), Steve Linz (177) and Kelly Kirchbaum (Hwt.)

With such top lettermen bolstered by a fine rookie group, the Wildcats hope to attain a higher national ranking that in 1975-76, when they finished 3/4 points behind Penn State, just missing the Top Ten in the NCAA finals, and came out ahead of such established wrestling powers as Navy and Slippery Rock.

The Wildcats expect additional points this year from Jimmy Carr and from last year's improved freshmen.

As defending champs, UK's biggest challenge will again come from Florida, winner in 1975 and runner-up in 1976. Tennessee and Alabama, returning their top SEC competitors, also should be strong challengers.

Wildcat fans will be treated to more home matches this season, with nine bouts scheduled in Memorial Coliseum. The schedule includes such top teams as Iowa, and Northern Iowa. The 'Cats will travel to Florida, the Lockhaven Invitational and the Midland and Nassau events for more tough competition.

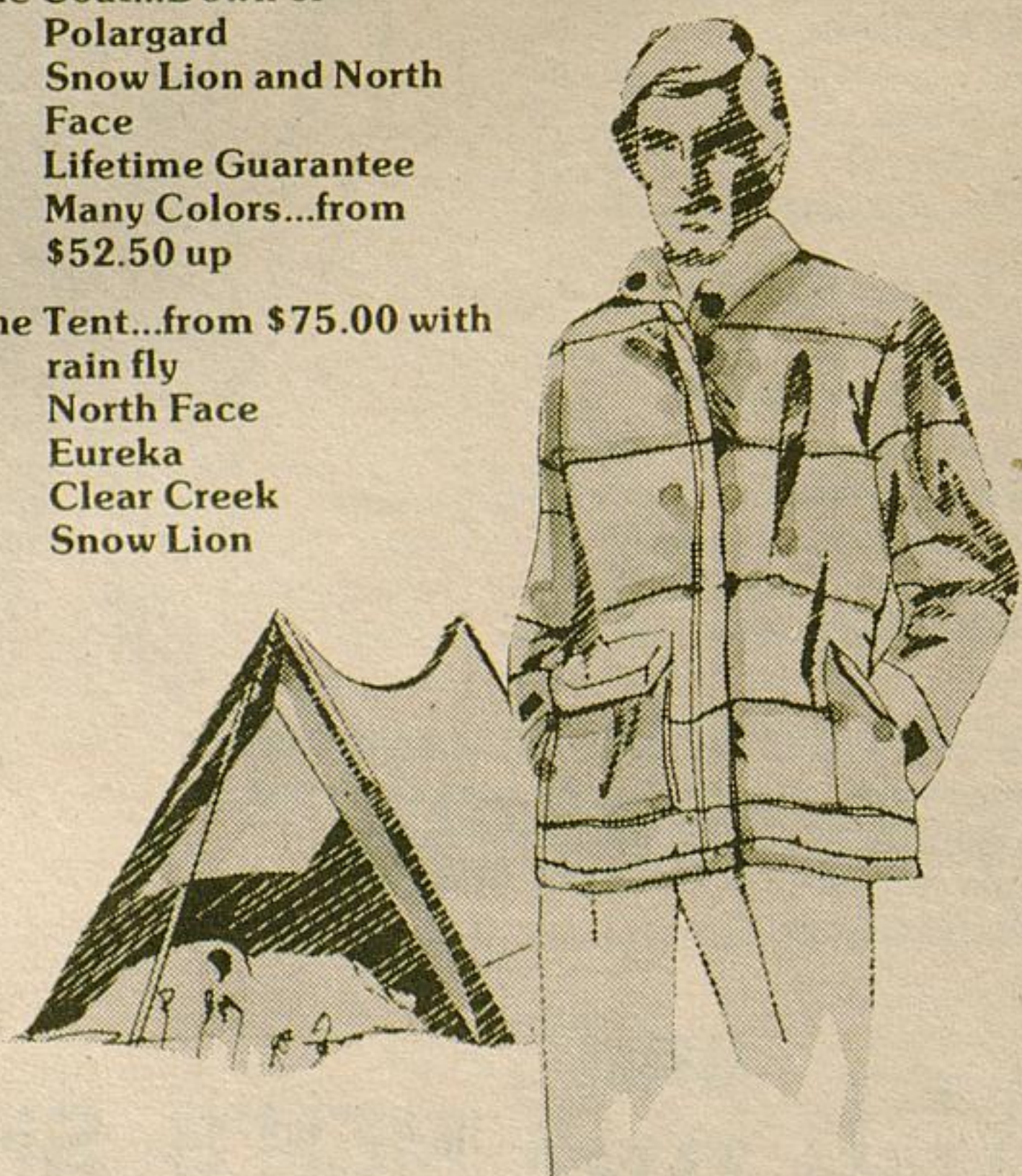
